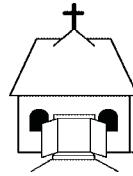

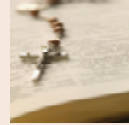

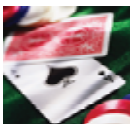

Scott's Corner

Did you see that they have installed the final lift of asphalt on the eastbound lanes of Vanderbilt Beach Road? We are salivating at the thought of utilizing them in only two more weeks. For those that have shied away from Sunday morning due to difficulty exiting the parking lot, our worries will soon be over. We are now hopeful that the church will be able to handle the increased attendance.

Since my recent solicitations regarding our columbarium wall have met with such success, I am including it yet again now that our seasonal residents are returning. The cost for a niche to inter one individual's remains is \$2,000 and \$3,000 to inter the remains of two. This all inclusive price covers the opening and closing of the niche as well as the engraving of the granite faceplate and perpetual maintenance. I am sure you will agree that this is a great deal and an incredibly beautiful and spiritual place of rest. I have compared prices at other local cemeteries and have found that our pricing is approximately 50% less than what is available elsewhere. If you would like to take advantage of this outstanding opportunity, please contact Sarah in the parish office.

Although you have seen the following announcement in the bulletin about a month ago, I was asked to include it again. This is a great opportunity for individuals with IRA's that must take required minimum distributions. The massive government bailout is going to have a positive effect here at St. Agnes. In 2006 and 2007 I was constantly touting the provision made by the government allowing individuals to make tax free IRA distributions to the charity of their choice. The provision unfortunately expired at the end of 2007. As part of the new Economic Stabilization Act, we are back in business. Please see below.

Congress has passed the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008, which extends for 2008 and 2009 an expired provision permitting IRA owners age 70½ and older to make distributions to qualified organizations of up to \$100,000 per year (Tax Extenders and Alternative Minimum Tax Relief Act of 2008, H.R. 1424). No income tax deductions are available for IRA "qualified charitable distributions," but donors may save taxes anyway, where gifts take the place of required minimum distributions (which otherwise are 100% taxable). To make a 2008 gift from an IRA, donors should contact their IRA trustee or custodian as soon as possible – preferably before receiving any required minimum distributions. Transfers for 2008 must be completed by December 31, 2008. Distribution checks should be issued in the name of a qualified charity, not to the account owner, with notification to the charity.

The rules are the same as for IRA gifts made in 2006 and 2007:

- **Donors must be age 70½ or older and own a traditional or Roth IRA. Other retirement plans, such as pensions, 401(k) plans and others are not eligible.**
- **Only the IRA trustee can transfer gift amounts to a qualified organization. If IRA owners withdraw funds and then contribute them to charity separately, amounts withdrawn will be included in the donor's gross income.**
- **No charitable deductions are allowed, but gift amounts will not be included in the donors' incomes. IRA gifts may satisfy charitable pledges, according to the IRS.**
- **IRA gifts may not exceed \$100,000 and must be made before 2010. Note that up to \$100,000 may be distributed for both 2008 and 2009. The "ceilings" on contribution deductions (50% of adjusted gross income for cash, 30% of AGI for capital gain assets), do not apply to IRA gifts.**
- **IRA gifts cannot be made to charitable remainder trusts or other "life income gift" arrangements. Transfers are not permitted to donor advised funds or "supporting organizations."**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are nearly 37 million people in the United States who are struggling below the poverty line, and 13 million of them are children. Over a ten-year cycle, about 40% of the population of the United States has experienced poverty at some time. Poverty is caused not simply by the lack of financial resources, but by the lack of quality education, affordable housing, health care, child care, fair wages, and vocational training.

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has worked to create permanent, community-based solutions to the problem of poverty by funding programs that promote self-sufficiency. The success of these efforts is only possible through the solidarity of parishioners across the United States.

The majority of funding for CCHD comes through its annual parish collection. This year, the collection will be held the weekend of November 22/23. Of donations received, 25% remains in our own Diocese to fund local projects which help to strengthen our communities. The remaining 75% is sent to the CCHD national office to support anti-poverty initiatives across the United States.

The success of the mission of CCHD is not possible without *you*. You can stand in solidarity with the Catholic Campaign for Human Development to make a difference in your community and all over our nation through your prayers and financial support.
