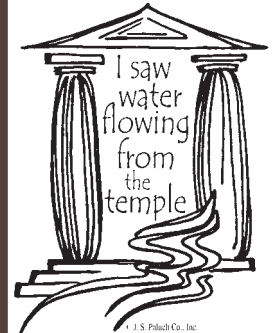

From the Desk of Fr. Bob

This has been an eventful week. The nation elected its first African-American President with the highest percentage of voter turnout in modern history at 64.1% according to one online source. The next highest in the last 50 years was 63.1% in 1960, the year President John F. Kennedy was elected. Regardless of your political inclinations, we must all remember to pray for President-elect Barack Obama and all of our newly elected or re-elected officials. May the Holy Spirit guide their decisions and work in support of the common good and the Gospel of life and truth.

On the parish front, we welcome Carol Gaby to our staff as Ministries Coordinator. In this role, she will promote existing and emerging ministries, coordinate with ministry heads and organizations, serve as a communication and coordination link to Fr. Jose and the many Hispanic Ministry offerings, conduct training/formation programs for parishioners in various ministries, develop new ministries, and facilitate greater offerings, activities and outreach for parish members and the charitable organizations with which we work. She also served on the Parish Council, Education Commission, Renewal Team, and worked in Preschool Religion, Christian Mothers, RCIA, home visitation and as a Eucharistic Minister. She later became a certified Diocesan Pastoral Minister following studies at Notre Dame College in Ohio, three years of monthly formation and integration sessions, and two field education experiences at a parish and Retreat House. She then served as a Pastoral Associate for twelve years at St. Basil the Great Parish in Brecksville, Ohio, directing ministries under the umbrella of the Parish Life Commission, coordinating ministries, groups, activities and events. We are so blessed to have Carol place her gifts and talents at God's service with us. Please welcome Carol to our staff and feel free to call upon her in her new role in service to the people of St. Agnes.

Many thanks to the Ladies of St. Agnes for conducting a wonderful bazaar in the Narthex a couple of weeks ago. They broke all records for the annual event which benefits St. Agnes. 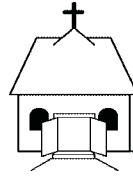

Scott's Corner

By the looks of the attendance numbers from Mass this past weekend, I feel it safe to say that many of our seasonal parishioners have returned to paradise. Welcome back to those that have just returned from all places north. We are looking forward to a wonderful "season" at St. Agnes.

Thank you for supporting St. Agnes by supporting the efforts of the Ladies of St. Agnes. The annual craft bazaar and bake sale held on October 25th and 26th generated nearly \$12,000.00 in gross sales. This is a truly amazing accomplishment and a testament to the incredibly generous parish family we have here at St. Agnes. Considering that the majority of the items for sale are handcrafted by the ladies, their expense is negligible. Congratulations to the Ladies of St. Agnes for their hard work in creating the items for the bazaar. As a reminder, 100% of the proceeds from this fundraiser will be used for the benefit of St. Agnes.

After a conversation this past Wednesday with the engineer responsible for the intersection at Collier Blvd. and Vanderbilt Beach Road, I have some very good news. The head engineer notified me that we will have all eastbound lanes of Vanderbilt Beach Road open by Thanksgiving. This means we will have two left hand turn lanes, three straight lanes and one right hand turn lane. In addition, for those that are arriving at Mass via the Southbound lanes of Collier Blvd. and making the left hand turn onto Vanderbilt Beach Road, both left turn lanes will be open at that time as well. Thank you to all of our parishioners for your patience during this extremely long and arduous road widening process. If all goes as planned, we should have no more exiting issues as of Thanksgiving. And this will be just in time for the heavy seasonal traffic.

As the year end is quickly approaching, I will include the following information regarding stock gifts to St. Agnes. If you have made or are planning to make a gift of stock to St. Agnes, the transaction must be processed through the Diocese of Venice development office. If you are electronically transferring the stock and already have the DTC number, it is imperative that you first call the DOV to let them know the details (i.e. name of stock, number of shares, specific allocation, and parish). Without this information, the stock arrives in the DOV account with no details of who the donor is and which parish to credit.

New York City Marathon update:

This past Sunday morning (November 2nd) while you were preparing to attend Mass, I was sitting outside of Fort Wadsworth on Staten Island in 38 degree temperatures waiting to begin my 26.2 mile trek to Central Park. At 9:40 am, a canon was fired indicating the start as me and nearly 39,000 brave souls made our way to the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge with "New York, New York" blaring from the massive speakers. To create a more dramatic start to any marathon I do not believe is possible. I could not wipe the smile off of my face as I made my way to Brooklyn even with the knowledge that for the next three hours I would face numerous trials and tribulations. With over 2 million spectators along the marathon route, you can imagine that the scene was "electric." In addition, there were over 100 bands entertaining us along the way. Although it was quite cold at the start, by the time I made my way into Queens, the temperature had risen into the low 40's. By the halfway point, my nemesis came into view. In my previous two New York City Marathons, the Queensboro Bridge which connects Queens to Manhattan had been my demise. This 1.2 mile incline is brutal at best however I had a different strategy this time around. By the time I arrived at the bridge, I had banked 1 ½ minutes so that I could take my time and not have to push in order to keep my pace. This strategy paid off immensely. As I left the bridge and turned onto 1st Avenue in Manhattan I was greeted by crowds 10 deep on both sides of the road all the way to the Willis Avenue Bridge. Entering the Bronx at mile 20 and very aware of the impending mythical structure standing in my way, I ran through "The Wall" and headed back into Manhattan for the home stretch. Arriving in Central Park at mile 23, I was greeted with massive crowds and a canopy of trees in full peak fall color. Adrenaline had the best of me now and with only 2 miles to go I was able to pull from my reserves and pick up the pace. As I turned onto Central Park South and headed for Columbus Circle for the final 1/2 mile, euphoria had set in as I was nearing the end of my journey. I crossed the finish line in 3 hours 13 minutes and 10 seconds or nearly 2 minutes better than my goal of 3:15. Thank you all for your thoughts and prayers and thank you for letting me share my marathon experience with you. It was truly magical! My wife also completed the marathon and we celebrated our accomplishment later that evening.

This past Sunday, many of our parishioners received an unauthorized circular on the windshield of their vehicles. This literature was a publication from the Republican Party of Florida. I am not sure who is responsible for its distribution but it was not approved by the Diocese of Venice nor did we authorize its delivery. Please accept our apologies for this unauthorized circular.
