The true owner is the Lord, who knows the motives of your heart.

Postures of the Mass

In the Mass, we pray not only with our lips, but with our bodies as well. We stand when the ministers enter. In Western culture, standing is a sign of attention, a mark of respect: all stand when the judge enters the courtroom, for example. Standing is also an ancient posture of prayer, mentioned frequently in the Old Testament. When the readings begin, we sit down: a listening posture. Mary sat at Jesus' feet to listen to his teaching; the crowds sat on the hillside or the seashore to hear his words. Kneeling is another posture that is full of meaning. It expresses adoration and worship, but it can also express humility and contrition. We bow: a sign of honor and reverence, acknowledging the presence of God, especially when we receive the Eucharist. And there are other ritual gestures as well--striking the breast, genuflecting, and of course making the sign of the cross. The liturgy invites us to pray with our whole person--with heart and mind, voice and body.

Human Trafficking

In the Florida Bishops' DVD Invisible Chains (which will be shown after Mass today), Bishop Frank Dewane reminds Catholics that, "we've only begun the journey to end the evil of modern day slavery." He calls Catholics to "speak out and work diligently on behalf of our brothers and sisters in captivity."

With that call, Catholics have a number of ways to do their part to end human trafficking.

- **Prayer** ~ The Bishops ask Catholics to pray for the rescue and restoration of victims, for the redemption of traffickers and for the protection of all human life.

- **Awareness** ~ Catholics are asked to call 1.888.3737.888 to report any possible trafficking situations, as well as disseminate the number. Also if you can't make the presentation after Mass today, then watch the Bishops' DVD, Invisible Chains, at www.flacathconf.org/humantrafficking and ask others to do the same.

- **Know the Church's teaching on the Doctrine of Social Justice and share it.** ~ Help others to understand how it should help them be more active citizens, petitioning the legislative representatives on the state and national level for comprehensive immigration reform, for just international trade policies, for better human trafficking victims protection, for stricter penalties in prosecuting traffickers, and for any legislation that upholds human life from conception to natural death.

- **Buy and promote Fair Trade.** ~ Because Fair Trade has proven to be the best system of just trade and is in line with the Church's teachings, Catholics in a special way are called to do their part in expanding the Fair Trade movement. Go to www.crsfairtrade.org to learn more about fair trade and purchase products.

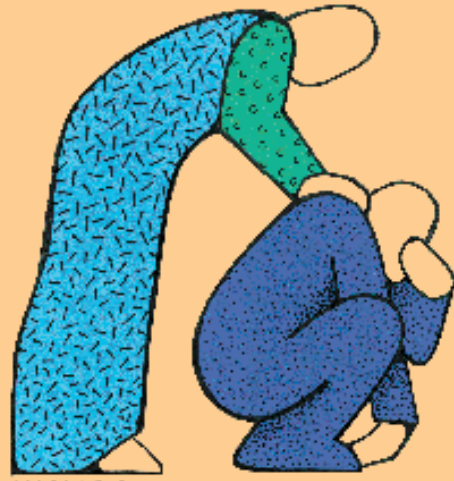

If we think of ourselves as individuals coming to worship, we lack the focus inherent in the liturgy itself. If we think of ourselves as the gathered assembly, the Body of Christ, come together to worship God in Christ's name, then it becomes understandable why the prayers are addressed to the Father to whom Jesus also prayed. Listen to the prayers, all addressed to the Father, all first person plural.

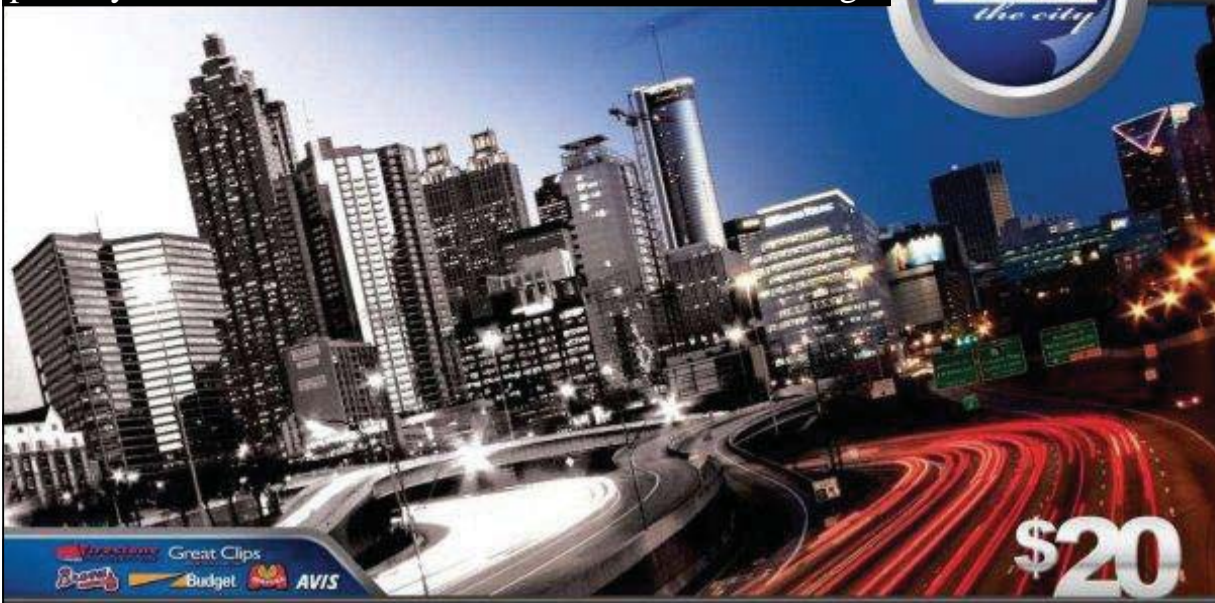

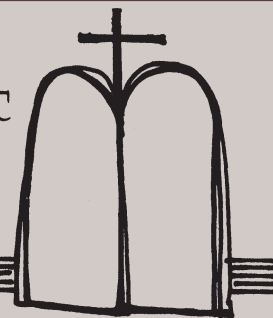

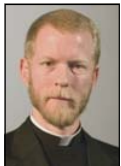
