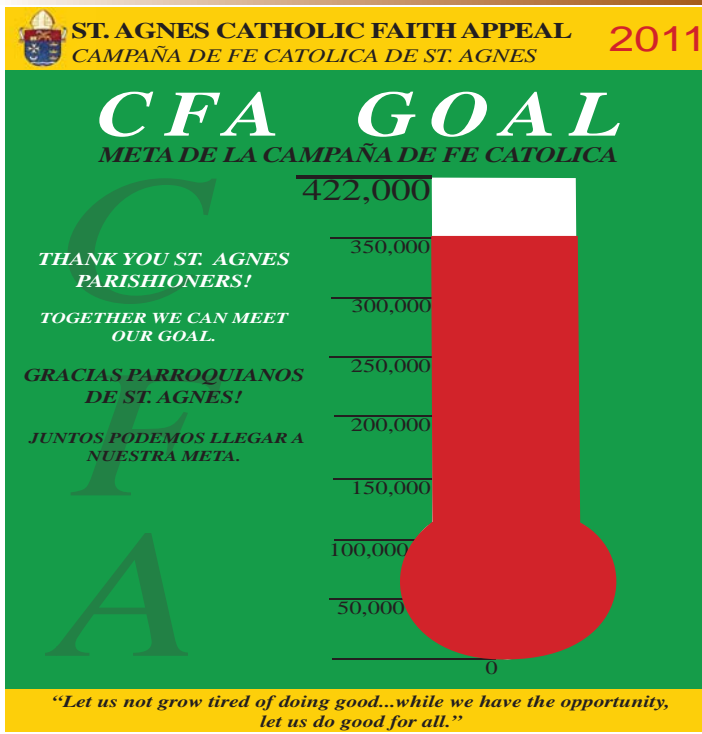

### THE GIFT OF THE REIGN OF GOD

Matthew's Gospel today expands on Isaiah's ballad considerably. A comparison with the same story in Mark's Gospel clearly shows us that here the author is busy teaching this community of Jewish Christians: "This is a story about Israel a long time ago; this is also a story about Jesus and the skeptical leaders."

Jesus as much as told these Jewish leaders that they were the tenants who first stoned their own prophets. And he told the leaders they were the tenants who would soon even dispose of him—Jesus—and, in doing so, would forfeit their privileged place of presenting to the world the promised Messiah.

"And this," says Matthew's Gospel, "is a story about you, the inheritors of what was first offered to Israel." The reign of God was first opened to Israel and is now given to the whole world, but it must be received as a gift. The first Christians are the new tenants in the vineyard. The deeper reality of the reign or kingdom of God is that it is available to everyone on the face of the earth—Israel included.

## Thoughts from Fr. Bob

St. Agnes has more than 3,900 registered families. People sometimes ask me how many individuals that represents. It's nearly 11,000! Last weekend's Mass attendance was about 3,500. And, as much as we encourage everyone to register, some of those in attendance are not registered parishioners. (To become one, just fill out the form on the credenza in the narthex.) So, where are the rest of those 11,000 on a Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning? Good question. Some are seasonal parishioners, so they're hopefully attending Mass elsewhere. That still leaves a fair number not attending at all, or at least not every week. If your friends and neighbors are dormant or occasional Catholics, invite them to Mass with you! There's nothing more exciting than sharing our life in Christ! And, there's nothing more essential to that life than the Sunday Eucharist.

More than doubling in size in four and a half years has stretched us in many ways. Our staff has increased as I'll explain below, but the demands of more parishioners, new programs and additional activities have continued to spread us very thinly. As far as clergy goes, we're behind the curve when it comes to the usual ratio of one priest per 1,000 families. In addition to his duties here, Fr. Tom serves as chaplain at St. John Neumann High School, on the Presbyteral Council, the Convocation and Retreat Committee, and sometimes serves as MC for the Bishop. Fr. Jose splits his Hispanic Ministry duty between here and St. Elizabeth Seton, plus Spanish Masses he's called upon to celebrate elsewhere. Fr. Austin comes down from Sarasota for the weekend to cover the Latin Mass, Confessions and instruction. I have additional duties as Vicar Forane (dean) of the Southern Deanery, serve on the Catholic-Jewish Dialogue of Collier County, and am a member of the Diocesan Presbyteral Council, Priest Personnel Board, and Planning and Development Committee, not to mention outfielder for the parish softball team! So, you might say that we are all running full speed!

In response to increasing demands and to help guide an ever-increasing number of ministries, organizations and activities, we've made some staffing changes this year. In the spring, Robert Massey was elevated from part-time to full-time as Coordinator of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. We're off to our best year yet in youth ministry! The new parish center youth room is a perfect setting for our young parishioners, and with attendance in the 60+ range for both Middle School and High School groups, it's the place to be for our young people. The best spiritual insurance policy a parent can take out for their child, apart from being at Mass, is having them at youth group. We could always use more young people, since none of them yet has shown an ability to beat me in ping-pong! I can't wait for the annual "Football with Fr. Bob" next Sunday evening!

In August, MaryBeth Gowdey was hired as receptionist and then elevated to Communications and Volunteer Coordinator a month later. It is an upgrade of the Volunteer Coordinator position that Carol Gaby fulfilled on a part-time, seasonal basis. It includes a new communications component that will assist with all of the ways we have to keep in touch with you, from the front sign and bulletin board, to mail and e-mail, to some more innovative means we're looking into. I'm grateful to Carol for getting us to this point and excited about what MaryBeth brings to the parish. She will also assist with the coming Capital Campaign. Check out her biography in another section of this bulletin.

A third change to our staff came with the hiring of Charlotte Locke as our receptionist. Charlotte worked for us previously part-time. Her knowledge of parish operations and staff made her a seamless addition to the St. Agnes team. With Charlotte's arrival, Adriana Purcell shifts to other administrative support duties, and Jean Faup retires, though we look forward to calling her back when we need an extra hand. She was the smiling face at the front desk and friendly voice on the phone to many, and we're grateful for her service.

October is Respect Life Month and a month especially dedicated to the Rosary. I hope that you will consider committing yourself to this beautiful devotion, and when you do to pray for an upholding of the dignity of life from conception to natural death. As a parish, we have a dedicated Rosary time before each weekday Mass. Some families I know pray it together. It's a great way to share this beautiful devotion, and as the old saying goes, "A family that prays together stays together."

Finally, later this fall, we expect to have the road and walkway connections between the church and the new parish center complete. County approval was obtained in August, and our engineer spent much of September getting plans for both properties that existed in different and older versions of computer software to agree. That now gives us a comprehensive site plan with all the information we need to go to bid on the project. As early as Thanksgiving, we hope better traffic flow on and off our property will be another reason to give thanks!

“Y éste”, dice el Evangelio según san Mateo, “es un relato sobre ustedes, los herederos de lo que fue primeramente ofrecido a Israel”. El Reino de Dios fue abierto primero para Israel y ahora es ofrecido a todo el mundo, pero debe ser recibido como un regalo. Los primeros cristianos son los nuevos viñadores. La más profunda realidad del Reino de Dios es que está a disposición de toda persona sobre la faz de la tierra, incluso a Israel.

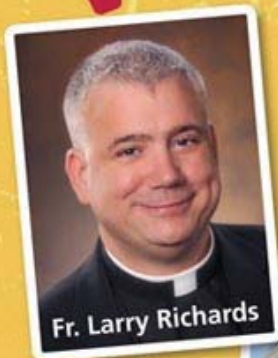

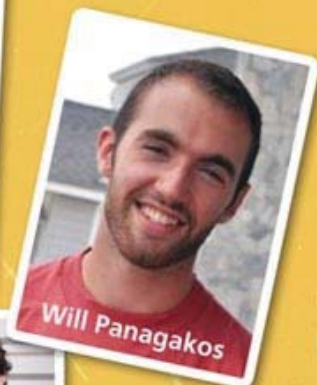

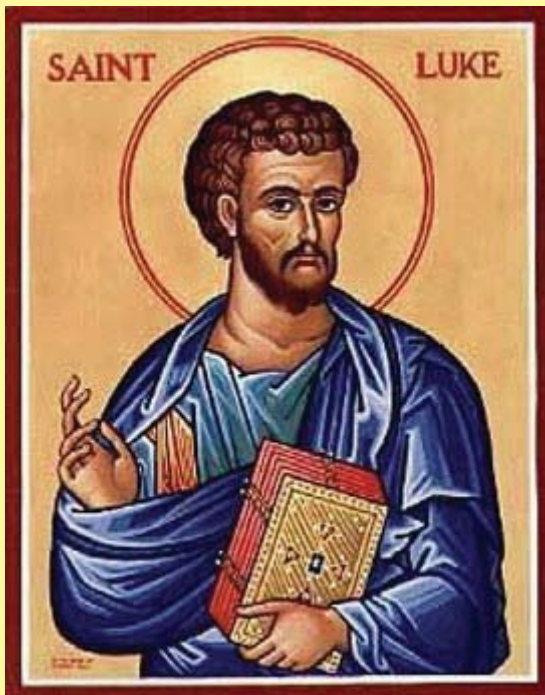
